The World Heritage Site Völklinger Hütte is the world's only fully intact ironworks from the zenith of the industrial era. Today, with its many halls, open spaces and fascinating tangles of pipe systems, it offers a unique setting for international exhibitions, festivals and concerts. What's more, it's a place where culture and nature meet: what was once the "hell" of the coking plant, for example, is now a truly wild PARADISE.

**The Ironworks
once and now**

A monument of industrial culture

The historical facilities of pig iron production are completely preserved and accessible at the Vöklinger Hütte. More than seven kilometres of visitor paths lead to milestones in technological history, such as the ore inclined hoist, the sinter plant, or the enormous flywheels of the blowing engines. In 2024, the technically fascinating masterpiece of dry gas cleaning will be opened to visitors.

Events and festivals

Völklinger Hütte is a place that keeps reinventing itself: exhibitions, festivals, theatre productions and concerts interact with their multifaceted industrial surroundings to create extraordinary experiences. In 2024, among other events, the FREISTIL FESTIVAL organized by the Network Freie Szene Saar will take place from October 2nd to 13th at the World Heritage Site. It will feature performances, music, and theater interventions involving participants from the entire SaarLorLux region and Germany.




A moving place of remembrance

Over the course of the two World Wars, more than 12,000 people were forced to work at Völklinger Hütte. The world-famous artist Christian Boltanski has created a poignant memorial to these forced labourers in the World Cultural Heritage Site. The thought of the daily work performed by ironworkers in times of peace subsequently inspired Boltanski to create a second installation using lockers and voices of memory.

In Paradise

In PARADISE, it is fascinating to observe how diverse flora and fauna have recaptured parts of the facility. Here fish and frogs now meet foxes and wild boar. Where once there was only heat, dust and fire, today birches and butterfly bushes bloom. Winding paths lead to works of art such as Ottmar Hörl's monumental 10-meter-high sculpture "KingKong" and an urban art leopard by the artist Mosko.





This major exhibition by World Heritage Site Völklinger Hütte and Deutsche Kinemathek Berlin offers for the first time a comprehensive overview as well as immersive insights into the special qualities of German film from 1895 to the present day. The exhibition reflects cultural history together with the history of the Völklinger Hütte before, during, between and after the wars of the twentieth century.



The Urban Art Biennale of the World Heritage Site Völklinger Hütte is one of the largest showcases worldwide for this anarchic art form, diverging from traditional white cube aesthetics. Since 2011, every two years, the entire area of the Völklinger Hütte has become an ideal dialogue partner for art stemming from street art and graffiti. In 2024, the focus lies not only on political in-situ works but especially on participatory Urban Art projects.

The exhibition MAN & MINING brings together artistic perspectives on global resource extraction in the digital age. Central to this exploration is the 'human resource', enabling the industrial dominance above and below ground. Within a specially developed exhibition landscape in the ore hall, photographs, object art, and spatial installations interact, shedding light on the consequences of extensive extraction for both humanity and nature.

A highlight of the 30th anniversary of the World Heritage Site Völklinger Hütte is the celebration of the UNESCO World Heritage Day for Germany taking place at the Völklinger Hütte. Guests from all over Germany will come together in Saarland this weekend to celebrate the UNESCO World Heritage idea. This event is being organised in cooperation with the German UNESCO Commission in Bonn.

THE TRUE SIZE OF AFRICA

9.11.2024 – 17.8.2025

The major exhibition explores the artistic and cultural approach to the vast continent through constant shifts in perspective and curatorial diversity. While a MUSEUM OF MEMORABILITY delves into Africa's history and present from the perspective of a Europe shaped by colonialism, artists from Congo and Namibia curate the presentation of African sculptures and objects from European private collections amidst the machinery and fly-wheels of the blower hall. Significant artworks by African artists from recent decades converge with specially created spatial and sound installations for the exhibition, allowing for an experiential understanding of THE TRUE SIZE OF AFRICA.



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
